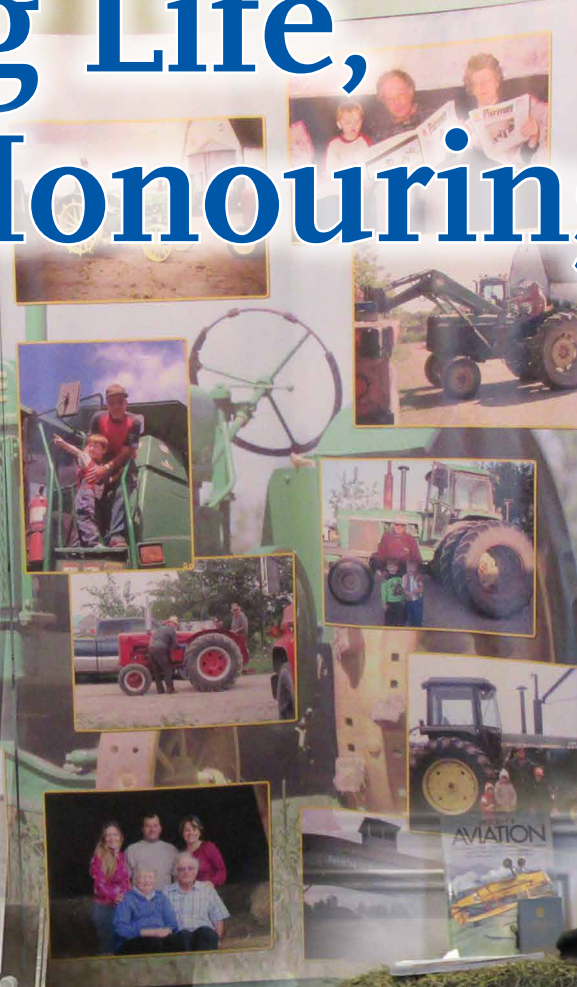

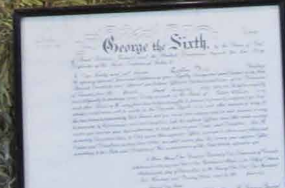

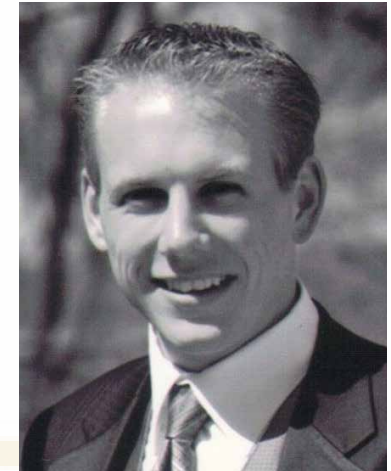
Who are we?

THE DEATH OF A LOVED ONE

At some point, every family has to face the reality that life ends. Sometimes it is the result of an illness, or after a long life, but sometimes it happens suddenly, with no time to prepare.

HEARING THE NEWS

When a death occurs, the immediate family has the task of letting other family members and friends know what has happened. This is often when the fact that a loved one has died begins to sink in.

FAMILY GATHERS

Often the family home becomes a busy place, as family members gather to make pressing decisions about what should be done next. Usually around this time the family meets with our funeral director, either at the funeral home, or at the family's home, to plan out the details of the funeral.

FRIENDS SUPPORT

As the word spreads, friends surround the family and offer support. People want to help by sending flowers or a card, calling, or dropping off a meal.

PUBLIC MOURNING

This is an opportunity for you to invite your community to join you in your grief, to offer support and to remember the deceased. Visitation hours provide a structured time for people to offer condolences to the family. A funeral or memorial service allows for a time to reflect, and to say goodbye. The tone of this service is often impacted by religious beliefs and worldviews held by the deceased and the family.

FINAL GOODBYE

At this point, we say goodbye to the body of our loved one, and begin to realize that life must go on without his or her physical presence.

PRIVATE GRIEVING

Grief does not end with the funeral. The grief a family experiences is very real and will last a long time. Often this is done in private, with close family and friends offering support. Many times we will begin to seek support from those who understand.

ADJUSTING TO CHANGE

Life must continue without the person who has died. Slowly an individual adjusts to the absence of the deceased. Life changes but it does go on.

Benefits of a Funeral Gathering

A funeral gathering, with its inherent reflections and remembrances, encourages the sharing of memories and activates support during this naturally difficult time. Equally important, the funeral ceremony helps survivors face the reality of death. This is the first big step in taking grief from the inside and allowing it to be expressed outwardly through mourning. The funeral gathering provides a safe place to acknowledge and affirm the worth of your relationship and express feelings of loss. In certain circumstances, the funeral gathering also helps individuals to release feelings of anger, guilt, resentment, coming to terms with the broken relationship, offering mending. Often, just seeing how much others care can be a tremendous help to a family in adjusting to their loss.

Ceremonies are well planned experiences often containing symbols, or symbolic gestures, that help us, together with family, friends and community, express our deepest thoughts and feelings about life's most important events. They are typically public events that serve to unite us by offering an event that is predictable and recognizable, thus providing a support system incorporating common beliefs and values. The act of gathering, the reading of words, singing of song, lighting of candles, help to give expression to the grief of losing a loved one when language alone cannot do so.

Professional & Staff Services

Basic Professional Fee \$1,200

("requires Basic Facility Charge)

The basic professional fee is payable whenever we provide services to you. Professional consultation with licensed personnel, which may include but not limited to, expert advice on options to meet your needs, including essential services relating to disposition, drafting notices, scheduling of services, advising of possible government benefits. Complimentary services include production of a legacy memorial video and hard covered picture book, as well as the opportunity to audio record ceremonies.

Co-ordinating Rites & Ceremonies \$400

Co-ordination of all rites and ceremonies, before, during and after they have been provided. This can include the co-ordination of facilities, clergy or celebrant, musician, the delivery of flowers, the scheduling of reception facilities and reception details.

Documentation Permits, Forms, etc. \$600

Completion and filing of all documents necessary to carry out the services and supplies requested including, but not limited to, death registration, burial permit and coroner's certificate for cremation. As part of this service, we will provide you with a minimum of twelve Funeral Director's Statement of Death (Death Certificates). These certificates are usually accepted for most estate settlement purposes. In addition, we will also prepare the basic government notifications needed, such as Driver's License, Health Card, CPP Death Benefit, Elections Canada, Social Insurance Number, Trillium and HST.

Transport Remains \$350

This fee covers the transportation of the remains from one place to another. For example, transfer from the hospital to our premises, or from our premises to the cemetery or crematorium for distances not exceeding 100 km. An additional fee of \$2.50/km for transportation outside a 100 km radius, one way only, will apply. We are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This charge applies for each transportation request.

Basic Preparation of Remains \$50

(requires Facilities for Preparation, Embalming & Shelter)

The preparation of the body for placement into the casket/container, including bathing, dressing, and the setting of facial features for identification or viewing purposes without embalming.

Embalming of Remains \$350

(requires Basic Preparation of Remains)

Embalming is the process of replacing blood and bodily fluids with chemical preservatives. It is a process of sanitation, restoration and temporary preservation. Embalming is not legally required by law, but may be recommended to preserve the body between the time of death and the visitation, cremation or burial. Our professional funeral director will make a recommendation based on the condition of the body and expected service needs.

Staff Services for Visitation \$225/hour

Staff to co-ordinate and oversee a visitation (informal gathering) for a period of one hour. Each additional hour will be charged at a rate of \$225 per hour. If the visitation takes place at an off site location, an additional staff service charge of \$100 per hour will be applied. This fee will include all additional personnel and equipment required to provide the visitation at an alternative location. A minimum charge of \$225 will apply.

Staff Services for Ceremony \$675

Staff to co-ordinate and oversee the funeral, memorial ceremony or life celebration at our premises or another location. The same fee can apply when having a “drop in,” “come and go,” “mix and mingle,” or “open house” reception over a two hour time period. These latter options allow for the opportunity to have a completely informal gathering without any structured ceremony and can still include informal speeches. If the ceremony was to take place off our premises an additional charge of \$300 would apply. This fee is charged per ceremony for additional personal and equipment needed to perform these services off premises.

Basic Facilities \$500

The use of our general and common areas, public washrooms, heating, lighting and maintenance. This charge applies whenever we provide services to the public.

Facilities for Preparation, Embalming & Shelter \$225

Facilities used to prepare, embalm and/or shelter the body; this charge applies whenever the body is in our facility for any purpose.

Facilities for Visitation \$200/hour

(requires Staff Services for Visitation)

Designated facilities used for visitation or gathering for one hour, which can be used during the morning, afternoon or evening. Each additional hour will be charged at a rate of \$200 per hour. A minimum charge of \$200 will apply.

Facilities for Ceremony \$600

(requires Staff Services for Ceremony)

Designated facilities at our funeral home used for the ceremony, memorial ceremony or celebration of life.

Service Vehicle \$350

This vehicle, along with a staff member, can be used for the delivery of flowers, transferring the deceased’s remains to the cemetery or crematorium, and any other trips that are necessary in conjunction with the services being performed by us. This fee is charged if, and when, the funeral coach is not used.

Administration Vehicle \$250

The use of vehicles is necessary to implement any funeral arrangements. This vehicle can be used in the picking up and filing of documentation necessary for our services. This vehicle can also provide clergy or celebrant transportation, as required, as well as the leading of the funeral procession. The charge for this vehicle is a flat fee for all funeral services performed by us.

Funeral Coach/Utility Vehicle \$350

This specialized vehicle can be used to transport the deceased from our facility to the place of the ceremony as well as to the place of final disposition. This vehicle can also be used for the safe delivery of remains to our crematorium, or other desired locations.

**Additional Mileage: an additional fee of \$2.50/km may be charged for each kilometre, one way, beyond 100 km from our facility.*

**All applicable taxes will be added to the prices indicated*

Other Services & Equipment

Facilities & Staff Services for Post Ceremony Reception \$400

This includes the use of our facility and staff to host a post service reception (2 hours). This is subject to availability and type of reception desired. No food or beverage costs are included in this fee.

Staff & Vehicle for Interment \$350

Many of our area cemeteries choose not to provide interments during the winter months (e.g. December – April). Dates may vary depending on the cemetery. This fee covers the cost of transporting the remains to the cemetery and co-ordinating activities including, but not limited to, arranging date and time with family, cemetery and clergy if required. It also includes the ordering of grave opening and closing, co-ordinating delivery and set-up of burial supplies.

Video Recording Services \$400

On occasion, families request that services be recorded for those unable to attend, or as a keepsake. We have the equipment and staff to accommodate this request no matter the location. Once completed, this recording will be professionally edited, whereby the raw footage is cleaned up and family photos are added. The final product can then be shared on our website or simply giving to the family for their own personal use.

Live Streaming Services \$400

This one-time fee covers the additional staff, equipment and technology to live stream an event. We use the "Zoom" platform and share the link either publicly or privately depending on a family's desires. The only way to experience this offering is "live" and no recording of the service is available afterwards. The availability of this service is dependent on the location of services, as the internet is not always available. Please inquire with our staff if you have additional questions about this option.

Acquiring Liquor License & Serving Alcohol \$350

On occasion, families request that alcohol be available as part of their services. We are happy to accommodate and assist with these requests, however as one can easily understand, there is additional time, resources and risk associated with this task. Please note, this fee does NOT include the cost of the actual license from the Alcohol and Gaming Commission, however we will also handle this task for you. This one-time charge also covers insurance for the event, smart-serve staff, and the pick-up, payment (from the L.C.B.O. at cost) and return of all alcohol and supplies.

Staff & Vehicle Surcharge for Time Delay (Same Day) \$350

An additional charge may be applied in the event of a delay between the ceremony and the interment on the same day or another day. (e.g. ceremony followed by reception then interment)

Weekend/Holiday Surcharge \$500

An additional charge will be applied in the event any services (e.g. visitation, funeral, memorial service, burial, celebration of life, etc.) are held on a weekend (Saturday, Sunday) or holiday. This fee will be charged on a per day basis. Although often ideal for families, weekend/holiday services present a variety of challenges for our staff. This cost will assist with the additional staffing costs associated with these services.

Hairdressing \$100

This fee covers the washing, cutting, styling, and colouring of the deceased's hair for family viewing. This service, and fee, will only be charged if the request is made by the family.

Delayed Visitation, Service or Celebration of Life \$500

This fee is charged when families choose to delay a visitation, service, or celebration of life for longer than seven days after the date of death. We realize that all situations and deaths are not equal, however we also want to be respectful of future families needs as well.

Removal of Pacemaker or Implant

The removal of a pacemaker or implant will be carried out by a licensed funeral director at no cost.

Are you thinking of burial?

Some facts about burial

The body is buried in a casket, and the casket may be placed in a concrete liner or a vault. The body can be buried after a visitation and/or funeral service, or before a memorial service. The body may be buried in the ground, or entombed in a mausoleum. Embalming is not required for burial, but may be recommended, depending on the visitation and funeral arrangements.

Do I need to purchase a vault?

Some cemeteries either require or recommend purchasing a vault to enclose the casket in the ground. This offers protection from the weight of the earth, and in the case of sealing vaults, protection from the elements in the ground.

What mementos or personal items can be placed in a casket prior to burial?

Any personal items can be placed in the casket, such as notes or photos, which can be a helpful way to say goodbye. We will ask you whether any jewellery or mementos placed with your loved one during the visitation should remain with the individual, or returned to the family. If desired, we can donate eyeglasses to charity.

Planning ahead

We believe it is a good idea to select burial plots ahead of the time of need if possible. Selecting a final resting place for a loved one is an important decision that we can help you with. We have information available for all cemeteries in the area and can provide you with comparisons so that you can make a decision that fits both your wishes and your budget. Please give us a call or send us an email if you would like any information about cemeteries in our area.

Are keepsakes for cremation only?

Some people find it helpful to have a part of their loved one to keep, as a special way to remember them. This is possible if you choose burial as well as cremation. Instead of cremated remains, a lock of hair, special note or photo can be enclosed in a keepsake for safe keeping. We have jewellery options that can incorporate your loved one's fingerprint or locket that will hold an important photo. Please ask us about the many options available to you.

Are you thinking of cremation?

The cremation process

Cremation involves reducing the body to bone fragments by applying intense heat for a period of two to three hours. The cremated remains are removed from the cremation chamber, and any metal objects are removed. The cremated remains are then processed, so that they are of an equal consistency. They will often appear white or grey in colour, and typically weigh between 1 to 2 kilograms.

What mementos or personal items can be placed in a casket prior to cremation?

Some personal items can be placed in the casket, like notes or photos, which can be a helpful way to say goodbye. Since most items will be destroyed as part of the cremation process, we suggest that jewellery be removed and placed inside the urn with the cremated remains after the cremation has taken place.

What funeral services can be selected if cremation is chosen?

Cremation does not limit the type of funeral services that may be chosen. In fact, cremation expands the options available to include all burial options as well. One can

choose to select a casket, have an open casket viewing or visitation, as well as select the type and location of the memorial gathering. Please ask us about all your available options.

Our crematorium

We, along with many other family-owned funeral homes, are part owners in Southwest Crematoriums Ltd. which was established in 2009. We presently operate locations in Flesherton, Guelph, Kitchener, Etobicoke, and Strathroy. As an owner, we are mindful of the needs of our families and keep the deceased in our care throughout the entire cremation process.

Attending the cremation

We are used to being present for the burial of a loved one, but have you considered attending or witnessing the cremation? Some families find it beneficial to accompany us and their loved one to the crematorium as a way of seeing the process through. If desired, you may even witness the beginning of the cremation process in a respectful manner. Many families have appreciated accompanying their loved one for a final journey. Ask us about how this might work for your family.

Wood Casket Selection

The value, selection and cost of caskets are affected by a number of factors such as materials of construction, design details and personalization features. Basically there are two types of caskets – wood and metal.

The two main purposes of a casket are to provide the primary protection of the deceased in burial, and to act as a focal point during the services. Therefore, choosing the right casket for yourself or a loved one is a very personal decision.

In addition, a Rental Casket Agreement is signed by the family to ensure they fully understand the concept of a "rental casket." The rental casket option is not available for burial.

Value of Viewing the Body

The traditions of our cultures are continually changing. Families are considering cremation and direct burials more often than before. Viewing the deceased has been a part of the death process for centuries, yet it is slowly fading away. The question is why?

Today, most individuals die in a hospital, nursing home or hospice setting where family and friends provide minimal care and have reduced contact with the dying individual. They are separated or protected from this reality of life. However, many are at a loss once the death occurs.

Grieving a loved one is a difficult process, no matter the circumstances. It is human nature for us to look for ways to lessen this trauma. Sadly, many feel that viewing the deceased will be a difficult task (which it is), so they choose not to. Others are concerned about the deceased's appearance, and feel it is better to remember them as they were prior to their illness or death. Sadly, this decision is final.
